GEOGRAPHY – Subject Introductory Information

<u>Introduction</u>

A general introduction to the subject.

Geography is a multi-faceted, diverse and exciting field of study. Geography is the key bridging subjects linking the Humanities, the Social Sciences and the Sciences. It provides an insight into each of these broad areas of human knowledge. People's impact on the earth, as reflected in the landscape, forms the central theme. The relationships between society and the landscape are highly complex, multifaceted and often contested.

- What will be the focus of first year.
 - -TI150 Principles of Human Geography: Introduces key problems, concepts and contexts of human geography
 - -TI151 Principles of Physical Geography: Introduces key aspects of the physical geography of the Earth
 - TI1100 / TI1101 Geography in Practice: A lecture and practical module that emphasizes field, mapping and laboratory skills with fieldtrip opportunities
- Why might students decide to take this subject?
 - Students studying Geography not only acquire an understanding of people's place in the world but they also develop a skill set (Research, Data Analysis, Computing/GIS, Cartography, Survey Techniques, Laboratory Techniques and others) that is widely applicable to many jobs and future careers. The combination of numerical and analytical skills are highly sought after by many sectors of employment.
- What subjects might be complementary to this subject?
 - Subjects that have proven to be popular combinations with Geography include Sociology & Politics; Economics (both important in the planning professions); Languages (work with NGOs); Law (for Civil Service posts); Archaeology (Heritage posts); History, English, Irish and Maths (Teaching profession).
- How might this subject relate to current events in society?
 - Students in our Geography Programme are engaging with some of the key challenges facing our globe and future generations. Geographers are urgently needed to help understand dynamic and relevant issues such as global warming; energy security and food security; the causes and consequences of migration; spread of disease (needed now more than ever); management of flooding, and the impacts of economic change on people and places.

Structure of the Programme

Overall structure of the subject over the three/four years of the programme.

You will study three subjects in First Arts. You continue to study two of the subjects that you pass in first year to degree level - in Second and Final Arts. 60 credits required for each year of 2nd and 3rd, each module carries 5 credits.

Are there any 'unusual' modules or activities i.e. fieldwork etc.

The first year programme in Geography is composed of three modules. Two modules are solely lecture based and one involves a combination of lectures, and practical's such as field trips and mapping exercises.

CÉIM:

Every student is automatically enrolled into a shared learning (CÉIM) session. CÉIM is an academic peer learning programme for 1st year Geography students run jointly by the School of Geography and Archaeology and NUI Galway Students' Union.. It is worth noting that regular CÉIM attendees perform better academically than those who attend irregularly or not at all. Benefits of CÉIM also include:

• Adapting easily to life at NUI Galway; Meeting other students; Coursework support; Help with exam preparation and skills development. Details of how these sessions will work under the current Covid 19 restrictions will be outlined in the Geography in Practice module.

Drop-in Help Sessions:
