Semester workload, full-time studies and grading system

Full-time study load is 30 ECTS credits per semester and 60 ECTS credits per academic year. The maximum study load per semester is 45 ECTS. For your reference: A 3-year Bachelor's Degree consists of 180 credits and a 2-year Master's Degree consists of 120 credits.

For most courses taught in English, grades are issued according to the ECTS-scale. For grades issued according to the Swedish grading scale (VG/G/U), please see the translation chart published on the website below. LiU does not have the possibility to convert the grades to other universities' grading systems.

Transcript of records

Linköping University does not automatically supply transcripts of records for its students. When students have all their grades, they need to apply for a transcript of records through the Lisam Portal (service free of charge). Information about this procedure is given to the students prior to departure.

Accommodation

Linköping University does not guarantee accommodation for all their incoming exchange students¹. We do, however, have a limited number of rooms that we offer exchange students on a first come, first served basis. Students apply for these rooms by using the same application form as for your courses. Application deadline is April 15 (for the autumn semester) and October 15 (for the spring semester), but the earlier one applies, the bigger the chance to get a room. The rooms are located in student corridors, with shared kitchens/living room and within walking/biking distance from the University. They are furnished and have a monthly rent of approximately 4128-4955 SEK (~ €365-440). A number of small studios are also available and have a monthly rent of approximately 5000 -6608 SEK (~€440-580). If a student is not offered a room from the University, they will get instructions from the housing coordinator at Linköping University on how to search for accommodation on their own.

Linköping University is based on four campuses at three locations in southern Sweden. The Faculty of Arts and Sciences offers courses in two of the campuses: Campus Valla (Linköping) and Campus Norrköping.

Swedish language courses are offered on both campuses. There is a bus connecting the campuses (free for students). We offer student accommodation in both cities.
