TRANSPORTATION

How to get to Prague



By plane

The [Václav Havel Airport Prague](#) (formerly Prague - Ruzyně Airport) - 50 regular airlines connect Prague directly to about 130 destinations around the world. Prague airport is not far from the city center and can be reached by bus or taxi.

By bus: There are several companies (Eurolines, Student Agency, etc.) providing luxury, air-conditioned buses. At present, you can travel to the Czech Republic by bus from practically any country in Europe.



By train: The Czech Republic is well-connected with the European rail network, with daily service to many European cities. For more details about traveling by bus and train within the Czech Republic and to neighboring countries, see www.idos.cz.



By car: The driver and all the passengers' seatbelts must be fastened. Use of a mobile phone is not permitted while driving. There are highway vignettes in the Czech Republic. There is a zero-tolerance policy for alcohol.



Taxi: One of the safest and least expensive solutions is to order a car through a taxi operator. The fares are usually much lower compared to hailing a taxi in the street (the difference can be up to 10 CZK / km).


Public Transport: Tickets for Public transport tickets can be bought at all metro stations and on buses, and at other [locations](#). You can also buy the tickets online from the Pid Lítačka app on your smartphone. For iPhones, you can download it from here: [Click Here](#). For Google Play: [Click Here](#). Basic tickets are also available at the newsagents ("trafika" or "tabák" in Czech), info centers, and ticket vending machines at selected tram and bus stops.

The orange validation machines print the date and time on the ticket. From this time on, the "validity" period of the ticket begins.

The underground runs from 4 5 a.m. until midnight (depending on the line). At night, you can use night buses and trams, which run every 20 minutes. For more information, visit the website www.dpp.cz.

Ticket inspection is likely to occur, and it is not worth taking the risk – if a passenger fails to produce a valid, properly stamped ticket, the fine can be up to 1500 CZK if not paid by 15 days. (approx. 61 EUR).

While studying at MUP, you can get a long-term pass that is cheaper than buying a ticket every day. For long-term passes, you will need a printed photograph (35 x 45 mm) if you buy it from the ticket offices. Pid Lítačka app might be an easier option if you have an ISIC card. (You will be informed about the ISIC card before your arrival.)

To get to the main building of MUP in Strašnice, where the International Office, Student Services, and MUP Library are located, take the green line of the **metro** (line A) to the **Strašnická** or **Skalka** station. It takes less than 10 minutes to walk to the university building from there. You may also take the **tram** no. **7** or **26** to Strašnická or tram no. **22** and **26** to Radošovická stop. Many buses connect this area with different parts of the city.

All IRES and a few International Business courses are held in this building. The International Office is in room 314 on the 3rd floor. The Orientation Day is held here.

MUP Foreign Languages Centre is situated at the final stop of **tram** no. **9, Spojovací**. Tram lines no. **9** and **11** run via Václavské Náměstí (Wenceslas Square) stop (metro station Můstek, lines A and B).

Anglophone Studies, Media Studies, and a few International Business courses, and all language courses (including Czech Language for Foreigners) are held in this building.

ACCOMMODATION

Unfortunately, Metropolitan University Prague does not have a dormitory and cannot provide housing on campus. In the process of finding your accommodation, be careful and do not pay in advance before seeing the flat yourself. We cooperate with some hotels (dormitory style) that offer long-term stays in Prague:

The academic year is divided into two semesters and starts in mid-October and ends in February. Each semester consists of 12 weeks of tuition and is followed by a 5-week examination period.

Courses for exchange students

MUP CLASSIFICATION SCALE:

- 1 - Excellent: 88 – 100%
- 2 - Very good: 74 – 87%
- 3 - Good: 64 – 73%
- 4 - Fail: 0 – 63%

Every course is allocated **80 minutes** of in-class lecturing per week during the 12 weeks of the semester. Students are expected to dedicate approximately the same amount of time to readings and class preparation.

The complete three-year Bachelor's Degree study program at Metropolitan University Prague is equivalent to 180 ECTS credits. The complete Master's Degree study program at Metropolitan University Prague is equivalent to 120 ECTS credits.

Language Courses

Czech Language for Foreigners

Exchange students can attend free of charge the language course Czech for Foreigners free of charge. Lectures are held twice a week in the MUP Jarov building, Učňovská 100/1.

Foreign Language Courses: Czech, English, French, German, Spanish

You may also attend other language courses free of charge. Besides Czech for Foreigners, the MUP Department of Foreign Languages offers the following language courses on different levels: English, French, German, and Spanish. The courses take place in the language classrooms of the MUP Jarov building, Učňovská 100/1.

Sport Courses

MUP Sports Club offers MUP and exchange students diverse sports and fitness courses such as ballet for beginners, basketball, beach volleyball, tennis, badminton, fitness training, floorball, football, power yoga, and Krav Maga. The students pay for attending these courses, which vary every semester. The fee for one lesson is around **80 CZK**. MUP Sports Club also organises annual tournaments in beach volleyball, indoor soccer, table tennis, and regular skiing, cycling, and hiking trips.

MUP library and study room

The Jiří Hájek Specialised Library is located in the MUP Strašnice building and provides study-related services to MUP and exchange students, collects, maintains, and loans specialised literature concerning the requirements of the MUP study program and its objectives. Students are welcome to use the online catalogue at (<https://www.mup.cz/en/library/>).

The usual loan period is 14 days.

Adjacent to the library is a study room where you can find workstations equipped with computers. You may use this area to access online study materials, edit your documents, save your files, and scan and **photocopy at the self-service photocopier**.

ISIC-MUP CARD

You are going to need an ISIC or MUP card to enter both of the buildings. The MUP card is **free of charge**. For the ISIC card, the fee is **250 CZK**. You can apply it from the SIS. In case of missing the card, a duplicate can be done for **150 CZK**.

MUP BUDDY TEAM

Organizing of MUP Buddy Team is our way of helping incoming exchange students establish social and academic networks as soon as they arrive in Prague.

MUP Buddy Team members = Czech students-volunteers are ready to:

- Be in touch with exchange students before their arrival via e-mail
- To provide pick-up at the airport/train/bus station
- Assist when reporting to the Foreign Police
- Arrange necessary documents, e.g., public transport card
- Guide you around Prague
- Be your friends
- Organise events such as trips and cultural Events


