Profile

As one of the largest universities in Sweden, with over 70,000 undergraduate and master's students, Stockholm University offers unprecedented access to teaching and research facilities. Stockholm University, located in Sweden's capital city, is the region's center for higher education and research in humanities, law, the natural and social sciences, and a focus for the work of leading international researchers. In the heart of Sweden's only national urban park, the University is surrounded by natural beauty, whilst being only a few minutes journey from the city center.

The Department of Media Studies (IMS) offer undergraduate, masters, and doctoral education in four areas: Cinema Studies, Journalism, Media and Communication Studies and Fashion Studies. IMS was founded in 2012 through a merge of the Department of Cinema Studies, the Department of Journalism, Media and Communication Studies (JMK), and the Centre for Fashion Studies.

IMS is located in 2 campus. The Section for Film Studies is located down town in the area Östermalm and the Section for Journalism, Media and Communication and Fashion Studies in the building at Campus Albano, House 4. Majority of IMS administration are located at Campus Albano and some days a few are located at Filmhuset.

Language of instruction	Swedish and English
Full time study load credits	30 credits/ECTS. Courses normally contain 7.5, 15 or 30 credits. Students can choose four 7.5 credit courses or two 15 credits courses or any other combination. One week of full-time studies equals 1.5 credits. The workload is 40 hours per week, including lectures, readings, assignments, seminars, independent studies. For questions regarding courses please contact the coordinator at the department offering the course.

Application information

Nomination deadline	For autumn semester: April 1. For spring semester: September 15. IMACS may have a later deadline.
Application	Through e-mail instructions after nomination. All students must have an official nomination from their home university to be eligible for exchange at Stockholm University. Students apply online.
Application deadlines	For autumn semester: April 15. For spring semester: October 1. IMACS may have a later deadline.
Application material required	Through e-mail instructions after nomination.
Language requirements	If students mother tongue is not English they must provide evidence that their English language ability meets the minimum requirements for admission to advanced level courses. Students from the Nordic countries do not need to take a test. The sending institution is responsible for ensuring that students meet the minimum agreed requirements agreed upon.

Course information

Students can choose freely from all courses offered at the Department of Media Studies given that they can meet minimum course requirements. Courses from other departments and faculties are subject to availability and cannot be guaranteed. The full course load is 30 ECTS/semester. **A minimum of 22,5 ECTS (75%) must be selected and studied at the Department of Media Studies during a 30 ECTS (100%) exchange load. Always select courses to a minimum of 30 ECTS at Department of Media Studies courses in your application if you intend to stay a full semester. For 15 ECTS = 10 weeks exchange full time studies, 30 ECTS = 20 weeks full time studies.**
