SPA-CODED INDEPENDENT STUDY MODULES

Our College offers a wide variety of independent study modules (coded SPA) for doctoral researchers. These independent study modules are completed by a postgraduate research student under the supervision of one or more academic supervisors. The research student and supervisor(s) are responsible for developing a feasible workplan that will ensure the student has met the module's learning outcomes.

Please note that there are no class meetings for these SPA-coded independent study modules, but they do have an online presence on Canvas.

A template Workplan Form is available on the CASSCS website and is linked from Canvas. A fully completed and signed copy of this form must be returned on Blackboard by the research student in order for credit to be awarded for module completion. In some cases, additional documentation must also be submitted (e.g. copies of work completed for credit).

	Research students will plan and complete a specified programme of professional development activities. This will normally involve the student's active participation in an agreed number of internally or externally organised events/workshops focused on professional development for researchers. It might incorporate, for example, relevant programming offered by the College, the University's Researcher Development Centre, a scholarly society, a professional body, or an interuniversity network. At the discretion of the research student's supervisor(s), assessment may include the submission of a reflective essay or other written account of the experience. Please note: this is an independent study module that the research student completes under the supervision of one or more academic supervisors. The research student and supervisor(s) are responsible for developing a feasible workplan that will ensure the student has met the module's learning outcomes. A pass mark will be awarded by the instructor of record upon the research student's timely submission of relevant documentation (submitted via Canvas).		

Marks for all SPA-coded independent study modules are returned by the Vice-Dean of Graduate Studies, who is the instructor of record, upon timely receipt of a completed Workplan Form. Specific deadlines for submission of completed workplan forms (normally at the end of semester 2) will be confirmed annually. For the 2022-23 academic year, Workplan Forms are due no later than **1 May 2024**.

SUPERVISOR-ASSESSED GS-CODED MODULES

Graduate Studies offers an array of modules (coded GS) that are available to research postgraduates from across the university and are solely assessed by the PhD supervisor. This supplements our College's suite of independent study modules for research postgraduates (coded SPA, described in the previous section). GS501: Seminar Programme or Conference Participation	5

	This module aims to give students the opportunity to further their knowledge in a broad range of research areas as presented in a set of research seminars or at a conference. Students are expected to read in preparation for attending seminars/conference, actively participate in the seminars/conference and to record and critically analyse what was presented. Students should write abstracts, succinctly describing the research presented. It is expected that students will discuss with their supervisor (and other research team members) the research presented. A reflective journal should be maintained by the student to record the student's learning experience on this module. Specifically, the relevance of the research presented to the student's research project should be included in this journal. Students may also prepare and present their own research seminar.	
GS526: Oral/Poste	r Communication	5
	Students taking this module will present their research findings regularly in poster and/or oral format at local, national and international conferences. This module gives students the opportunity to learn how to present their research to peer audiences using both poster and oral presentations. Students will have opportunities to interact with peer audiences, answer questions and receive feedback on their research. Specifically, students must deliver one oral presentation every year for three years within University of Galway AND one poster presentation within University of Galway AND one poster or oral presentation at a national conference AND one poster or oral presentation at an international conference. It is expected that students will improve their communications skills, both written and verbal, during this module and gain confidence in presenting their research to a peer audience.	
GS509: Participation	on in Workshops/Courses	5
	Students may have the opportunity to attend workshops or courses, provided by this university or externally, during their research programme. This module aims to give students the opportunity to further their learning on specific research skills/methodologies or in specific research areas by participating in such workshops or courses. Students are expected to prepare in advance of attending the workshop or course by, for example, reading the prescribed reading material. It is expected that students will attend and actively participate in the workshop/course. On completion of the workshop/course the student will be required to demonstrate their new research skills. Students should write a report on the workshop/course. Specifically the relevance of the new research skills or further research knowledge acquired to the student's research project should be included in this report. The supervisor will review this report and provide feedback to the student. It is expected that students will discuss with their supervisor (and other research team members) what they learned on the workshop/course. A reflective journal should also be maintained by the student to record the student's learning experience on this module.	J
GS515: Research P	aper Publication	5
	Students taking this module will develop the writing skills necessary to write a research paper and will learn about the publishing process. The student must write the entire first draft of the paper, in collaboration with co-authors when appropriate. The student must also format any figures and tables to appear in the paper. The student must use appropriate reference manager software, such as EndNote, to manage and format the references for the paper. The supervisor will provide feedback to the student and review all drafts of the paper. The student will be involved in selecting an appropriate journal along with the supervisor, will prepare the paper for submission and respond to the reviewers' feedback. In order to successfully complete this module, students must have a first-authored research paper accepted for publication in a peer-reviewed journal.	

Completion of this module may require the student to attend workshops or seminars, complete training (including online training), maintain a reflective journal recording the student's experience of their learning and/or completion of specific tasks or assessments. The content will be designed by the student's supervisor so as to ensure that the student can achieve the module's learning outcomes and that the supervisor can assess that the learning outcomes have been met by the student. The research student's supervisor is responsible for ensuring that the student has achieved the learning outcomes for this module and for recording this result in the student record system. The supervisor will gather and retain written evidence that the student t has achieved the module's learning outcomes. Each piece of evidence may only be used to demonstrate that the learning outcomes have been
