Michael Cusack Bursary

The Michael Cusack Bursary was established by the University of Galway, in association with Clare Co. Council and the Clare Gaelic Athletic Association (GAA) Co. Board, in 1997 to mark the sesquicentenary of the birth of Michael Cusack, founder of Cumann Lúthchleas Gael in Carron, Co. Clare in 1847. The Bursary, financed by the Galway University Foundation, will support a student engaged in a PhD or a Research Masters project on some aspect of the cultural heritage of Clare. This includes, but is not limited to, the Gaelic Athletic Association. The annual value of the Michael Cusack Bursary amounts to €3,620 per annum and is tenable for three years for a PhD or two years for a Masters by Research, subject to satisfactory progress. The holder will be required to register fulltime for a PhD or a Research Masters under the normal conditions, under the direction of the School of History and Philosophy.
