Moving forward in the measurement of sexual health behaviour among post-primary school students in Ireland

Testing new questionnaire items

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INTRODUCTION

This document reports on the development and testing of new questionnaire items for use in the Health Behaviour in School-aged Children (HBSC) Study on sexual health. Part 1 describes the cross sectional pilot testing of potential new items. Part 2 describes the test-retest pilot of potential new items. Appendix 1 contains the general comments received from participants in the pilot process about the questions. Appendix 2 contains a summary of the performance of the international mandatory HBSC sexual health items among the participants in Ireland.

This stage of the study process was informed by research carried out by members of the Sexual Health Focus Group of the international HBSC network. A comprehensive protocol was generated detailing the rationale for the proposed question items as well reasons for changing existing question formats. The theoretical framework of the protocol incorporated both the biopsychosocial model of health (Engel, 1977, 1980) and the lifespan approach. The biopsychosocial model has previously been applied to adolescent sexual health and behaviour as well as contraceptive use (Santelli, 1992). The protocol recommended changes to the formatting of the mandatory sexual behaviour items and optional packages on romantic relationships and first sexual intercourse were compiled. A skip pattern was introduced to the mandatory sexual behaviour items in order to simplify coding, to reduce inconsistencies across items, to increase comparability between paper-and-pencil surveys and computer-assisted surveys and to redirect respondents who have never had sex (Godeau *et al.*, 2013). The Romantic Relationships optional package was created as romantic experiences were identified as having a significant impact on mental health, development and future romantic relationships (Költő *et al.*, 2013). The First Sexual Intercourse optional package was designed in order to explore other dimensions that surround first sexual intercourse other than age of initiation (Moreau *et al.*, 2013). The protocol proposed all new questionnaire items be subjected to a pilot testing and test re-test reliability studies. The process also included a thorough review and quality critique of existing sexual behaviour measures. PART 1: Cross-sectional Pilot study of Sexual Health Questions

Aim:

To provide guidance on the utility and appropriateness of the new mandatory and optional sexual health items.

Objectives:

1. To provide clear guidance on the following dimensions of all proposed items: acceptability (including in different cultures), understandability, answerability, skew, translatability, relevance (to potential participants, to gatekeepers?).
2. To provide information on the contextual understanding of potential participants of the proposed items.

Context of data collection:

Ireland (n=233)

Pilot study data were collected from five schools. A predominantly Catholic mixed voluntary school (n=33), a Catholic boys' school (n=117), a Convent girls' school (n=34), a Catholic girls' school (n=34) and a mixed vocational school aimed at promoting the educational needs of children and young people from disadvantaged communities (n=15). Two/three researchers were present during data collection: 1 or 2 researcher(s) to conduct the discussion and 1 to take notes. Students were introduced to the HBSC study, the objectives of the pilot, individual data collection and collective discussion about each item, the overall topics and their appropriateness for other adolescents. In addition to sexual health items, questions on bullying and substance use were included.

Analysis:

Data analysis has been targeted at meeting the objectives outlined. The findings are presented using summary tables, together with detailed student feedback. There are three sections contained below, on romantic experiences, last sexual intercourse and first sexual intercourse. In each section summary tables of the responses received are provided along with the detailed student feedback received.

Summary tables: These tables present key information by questionnaire item (p1-21). Measures reported include mean, standard deviation, median, missing values and skew. Comments relating to participants' understanding of the questions (words underlined or identified as not understood) have been reported. In addition, students' comments have been reported relating to problems or concerns about the acceptability of the item, the relevance of the content, the overlap or similarity between questions, their ease of answering and any issues relating to the translation of the items.

Detailed student feedback: Appendix 1 contains participants' general comments (verbatim quotes) relating to the sexual health items presented in the questionnaire.

PART 2: Test re-test evaluation of sexual behaviour questions

Aim:

A test re-test of the sexual behaviour questions was conducted to provide guidance to the international network on the reliability of the new mandatory sexual behaviour items and the two newly introduced Optional Packages.

Objectives:

1. To provide guidance on the test re-test reliability and variability of the new mandatory sexual behaviour items and two optional packages using data collected on the same subjects and under similar working conditions.

Context of data collection:

Ireland (n=63)

Data were collected from three schools. One non-fee paying, mixed community school in the capital city (n=28), and two non-fee paying, mixed schools with a Catholic ethos in more rural areas (n=23 and n=12). One/two researcher(s) were present during data collection. Students were introduced to the HBSC study and the objectives of the test re-test study. Following individual data collection students were encouraged to participate in a collective discussion about the items, the overall topics and their appropriateness for other adolescents. In addition to sexual health items, questions on bullying and substance use were included.

Analysis:

Kappa statistics were calculated for each of the sexual health items. Kappa is most commonly used to measure inter-rater reliability. It is unclear what constitutes an adequate level of kappa for behavioural questions given that behavioural self-report can appropriately change from time 1 to time 2. However as a guideline, values of Kappa from 0.40 to 0.59 are considered moderate, 0.60 to 0.79 substantial, and 0.80 outstanding (Landis & Koch, 1977). Sufficient kappa is recognised as a value of at least 0.6 with a good level of inter-rated agreement at 0.7.

Findings:

The kappa findings for each sexual health item are presented in a summary table below (Table 1.1).

The kappa statistics indicate that 12 out of the 17 items contained a sufficient level of inter-rater reliability (i.e. kappa above 0.6). Items in which participants scored varied from time 1 to time 2 related to the use of 'other contraception' at first and last intercourse, the number of times engaged in sexual intercourse, perception of timing of first sexual intercourse and perception of age of first intercourse. These may reflect low numbers of participants reporting responses (e.g., the reported use of *other* methods of contraception, see Young, Burke & Nic Gabhainn, 2014), the variety of adolescents' responses (e.g., the perceived age of first intercourse) or actual changes in adolescent behaviour from time 1 to time 2 (e.g., number of times engaged in sexual intercourse).

SUMMARY

In order to ensure useful, accurate and appropriate information is collected from young people through the HBSC survey it is vital that all questionnaire items are thoroughly tested for both reliability and validity prior to being added to the questionnaire. The above pilot and test re-test studies provide an effective review of the proposed question changes and additional questions for use in the 2014 HBSC study. They have successfully informed decisions made by the HBSC international network on both mandatory and optional sexual health and behaviour items for use in the upcoming wave of the HBSC study.

Following findings from the pilot and test re-test studies the HBSC international network is to include the new mandatory sexual behaviour questions, which involves the introduction of a skip pattern, into the latest survey instrument. This change was identified as favourable through the testing process as it was clearer, resulted in fewer inconsistent answers and also reduced the number inapplicable questions sexually inactive participants need to answer. The testing process has informed the development and wider use of the Romantic Relationships Optional Package and the First Sexual Intercourse Optional Package. These packages contain questionnaire items which have been deemed both understandable and appropriate for adolescents aged 15 years and older, as well as valuable to the research area of adolescent sexual health and behaviour.

In the context of Ireland the pilot and test re-test studies also aided in the selection of the First Sexual Intercourse Optional Package for inclusion in the national HBSC 2014 questionnaire. As a result of the testing process this package was identified as suitable for use in the Irish survey and also an important instrument for contributing to the knowledge on the sexual health and behaviour of Irish adolescents.
