Scope of the Data

School-going children aged 9-18 years complete questionnaires about the context in which they live their lives (within their family, peer, school, and local area), about their health, and predictors of their health.

History of HBSC International

The HBSC study is a World Health Organisation (WHO) collaborative study which collects data from 44 countries and regions in Europe and North America. The network has grown over the past **30 years** beginning in 5 countries in 1984. Data is collected every 4 years from samples of 11, 13 and 15 year-olds within each participating country.
