Optional Modules

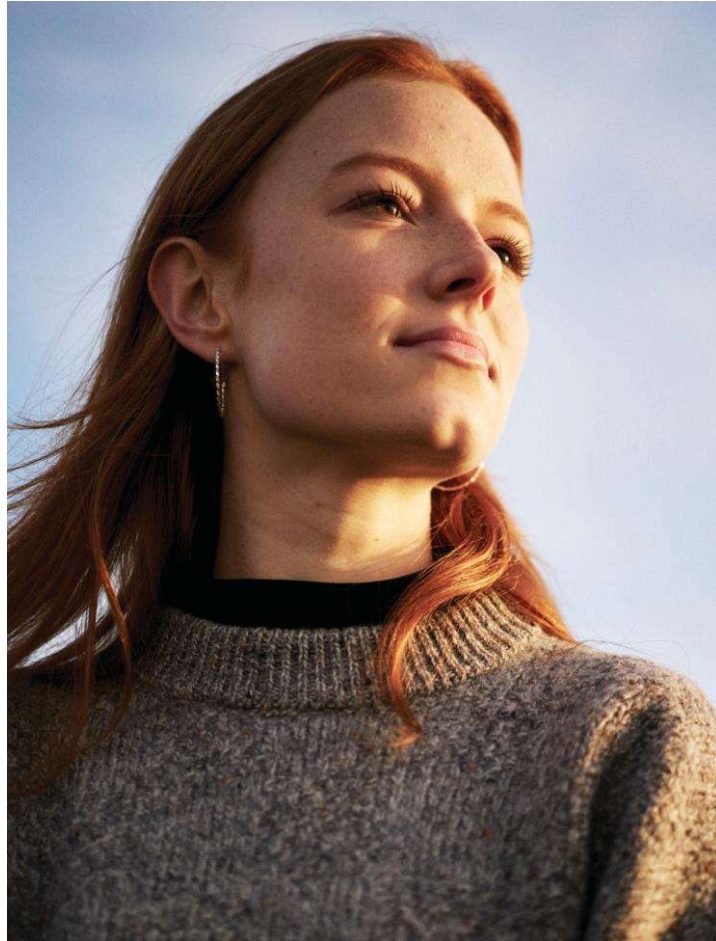
- Mental Health Promotion
