**Marie Skłodowska-Curie Doctoral Researcher Post on Rurality, Rights and Sustainability and Ageing in Place Policy –HOMeAGE–**

**Ref. No. University of Galway 340-22**

Applications are invited from suitable qualified candidates for a full time, fixed term position (36 months) as a Doctoral Researcher (DR) at the Irish Centre for Social Gerontology (ICSG) in the J.E. Cairnes School of Business & Economics and based within the Institute for Lifecourse & Society, University of Galway. This position is one of 12 doctoral researchers being recruited as a part of a European-funded Marie Skłodowska-Curie Doctoral Network (DN) on Advancing Research and Training on Ageing, Place and Home – ‘HOMeAGE’. The successful applicant will be registered for a PhD at the University of Galway, and will work on the topic of ***Rurality, rights and sustainability in home care and ageing in place policy*** with Professor Kieran Walsh and Dr Marie Mahon (University of Galway) in collaboration with Mr Nat O'Connor (Age Action). Only applicants who have not been resident in Ireland for more than 12 months in the three years preceding the start date are eligible for this post.

**About HOMeAGE**

HOMeAGE involves a nine-country collaboration between leading research units, major intergovernmental organisations, international civil society actors and governmental and non-governmental organisations. HOMeAGE aims to institute an interdisciplinary, intersectoral, and international programme of doctoral training and research that drives the development of new leaders in excellence for the advancement of evidence-based innovation on ageing in place. HOMeAGE will address the three interconnected challenges of (1) needs and systems, (2) home and belonging and (3) rights and voice. The 12 Doctoral Researchers will be hosted across the network, and in addition to conducting an original research study they will participate in a 36-month network-wide training program, public engagement activities and collaboration with network members through short-term secondments in European intersectoral partner organisations.

**About the post and the research project**

This full-time post will be available, subject to funding, from September 2023 and offered on a fixed-term 36-month contract. This post benefits from a highly competitive and attractive salary, plus mobility and family allowances as applicable. Working as a part of the ***Rights and Voice*** work package, the successful applicant will complete a research project on: ***Rurality, rights and sustainability in home care and ageing in place policy***. The objectives of this research will be to examine (1) the representation of ‘rurality’ and needs in ageing in place, homecare and Covid-19 policies for heterogeneous rural dwellers; (2) to examine European patterns of homecare access in rural sites, charting potential rights violations and inequalities; (3) to examine the lived experience of homecare for diverse groups (gender; new-comer/native residents; ethnicity; class) in 2-3 international rural sites, and responses to address needs during Covid-19.

It is expected that this project will involve mixed methods, including qualitative, but also quantitative dimensions. The successful applicant will complete two 4-month secondments. The first will take place in Belgium with Vrije Universiteit Brussel (Prof. Liesbeth De Donder) and will provide learning on social anthropology theory and methods relevant to ageing in place. The second with Age Action Ireland will expose the researcher to public health and policy translation techniques. Expected outputs will include peer-review academic papers, and two policy briefs. ### **About the Irish Centre for Social Gerontology (ICSG)**

The ICSG, which is affiliated with the Discipline of Economics at the J.E. Cairnes School of Business and Economics and located within the Institute for Lifecourse and Society, is an interdisciplinary, internationally recognised, research centre, with an extensive track record in producing impactful and applied scholarship. With a view to informing a holistic understanding of later life in public policy, the ICSG conducts research on ageing and the life course that responds to gaps in scientific knowledge, policy and practice, while promoting the diversity of ageing experiences. The work of the ICSG is particularly focused on supporting the voice of marginalised groups of the older population, and integrating these perspectives into research and public policy design and development. Directed by Professor Kieran Walsh, and comprising of academic faculty, senior, post-doctoral and doctoral researchers, and strategic support staff, ICSG conducts research in the areas of place and community, social exclusion and inequality, work and retirement, dementia, and infrastructures of care. ### **Position Duties**

We are seeking to hire a motivated and committed doctoral researcher with a strong interest in conducting original research on ageing and place. The successful applicant will:

- Complete 30 ECTS of taught modules as required for the Structured PhD Programme at the University of Galway;
- Complete a research proposal for the work package, containing research objectives, description of research, methodology, proposed completion timeframe, originality of contribution and societal impact;
- Complete an original research project on the topic of rurality, rights and sustainability in home care and ageing in place policy;
- Participate in network-wide training events in the course of the project and complete any additional training required to successfully carry out the research proposal;
- Adhere to and develop materials for HOMeAGE reporting and personal training requirements (e.g. Personal Career Development Plan; annual summaries of research findings; Impact Action Plan for societal impact);
- Prepare and disseminate research findings, in academic journals and for relevant stakeholders;
- Prepare regular research updates for the HOMeAGE website and social media accounts;
- Prepare a manuscript for submission as a PhD thesis in accordance with the policies and procedures of the University of Galway;
- Work with the PI in preparing funding proposals related to the DR's area of research.

## **Qualifications/Skills required:**

Candidates will be required to meet the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Doctoral Researcher eligibility criteria (<https://marie-sklodowska-curie-actions.ec.europa.eu/>), and criteria specific to this project.

## **Requirements:**

- At the time of application, applicants must not have resided in the (host country) Ireland for more than 12 months in the three years immediately before the appointment;
- A Master's degree (high honours standard) and an excellent track record of academic achievement;
- Demonstrable experience of conducting mixed-method research is desirable, with a strong knowledge of case-study approaches (with qualitative methods), secondary analysis (e.g. using STATA; R), and critical discourse analysis is particularly welcomed.
- Excellent online literature searching and retrieval skills.
- Have excellent communications skills in English both written and verbal;
- Ability to and commitment to producing scientific outputs for publication in peer reviewed journals;
- Evidence of ability to work independently and collaboratively within an internationally diverse research team;
- Highly motivated, with excellent organisation skills and with strong attention to detail and quality.
- Willing to travel to attend secondments, training and academic events.

## **Employment permit restrictions apply for this category of post**

**Salary:** €35,836.82 per annum plus mobility and family allowances as applicable and in line with the EC rules for Marie Skłodowska Curie Doctoral Networks 2021.

**Start date:** This position is funded by Horizon Europe under the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Doctoral Network programme and is available from 1st September 2023 to contract end date.
