<p>Academic calendar (approximate dates for a typical year)</p>	<p>Fall Semester: 14 September – last week of January 12 course weeks, starting in the week of 14 September Winter exam session: from 2 January until 25 January</p> <p>Spring Semester: 1 February – 30 June 12 course weeks, starting at the beginning of February. Summer exam session in June</p> <p>A re-sit exam session is organized at the end of August/beginning of September</p> <p>https://www.unamur.be/etudes/etudiant/calendrier</p> <p>Remarks: significant changes on the length of the terms are expected as of the beginning of the academic year 2023-2024. They are not known yet.</p>
<p>Accommodation on campus</p>	<p>The University of Namur offers a (limited) number of rooms to international students either in the “International House” or in the “kot-à-projets” (KAP).</p> <p>The International House is a self-catered 5-floor residence managed by the University Housing Service. Each floor is equipped with individual rooms, a shared kitchen, bathroom facilities, and a sitting room.</p> <p>A KAP is a ‘project-related’ shared flat, where 6-12 students live together (individual rooms, shared kitchen and bathroom facilities) and commit to develop and complete collective projects of their choice. The projects often concern music, photography, sports, environmental issues, international humanitarian rights, support for local producers, etc.</p> <p>https://www.unamur.be/en/international/exchange/housing</p>

<p>Health insurance</p>	<p>Students from the EU: European Health Insurance Card</p> <p>All other students: Legally required health insurance (such a comprehensive health insurance for students can be bought through UNamur at about € 40,00 per month)</p>
<p>Integration weeks (fall) Integration days (spring)</p>	<p>Organized every year before the beginning of the fall semester (first two weeks of September), the orientation weeks consist of French or English as a second language courses (worth 3 ECTS credits) and cultural and social activities to facilitate the integration of international students.</p> <p>A similar event (without language classes) is organized during three days in early February. https://www.unamur.be/en/international/exchange/orientation</p>
<p>Courses of French as a second language x</p>	<p>During your stay you can attend a beginner, intermediate or advanced course (3 ECTS credits).</p> <p>A placement test is organized at the beginning of each semester.</p>
