Learning Expectations

Attendance: Attendance is expected, and in some courses, it's mandatory for your final grade.

Grading: The university uses a 20-point scale (0-20), with 10 being the minimum passing grade. The table below shows how ECTS points correspond to this scale:

ECTS Grade	Approximate Percentage of Students Achieving Grade	Description
A	Top 10%	Highest marks (18-20)
B	Next 25%	Marks in the range of (15-17)
C	Next 30%	Marks in the range of (12-14)
D	Next 25%	Marks in the range of (10-11)
E	Bottom 10%	Lowest marks (0-9)

Portuguese as a Foreign Language

- Develop basic skills in the use of Portuguese - verbal and written.
- Diploma awarding Level: A1 or A2 (based on the Common European Framework)
- Credits : 2,5 ECTS - can be recognized by the sending institution, but comes in a separate certificate from the rest of the courses taken
- Contact hours: 54
- Has a fee of 125€
