ABOUT AUGUSTANA

Founded by Swedish settlers in 1860, Augustana offers 90 majors and areas of study. Our selective, private liberal arts college hosts NCAA III varsity athletic teams. The beautiful 115-acre wooded campus is located along the Mississippi River in Rock Island, Illinois, part of the Quad Cities (population 400,000), about 165 miles west of Chicago.
