APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Exchange Program Application (.pdf only)
- 2. Official university/college-level transcript(s) in English
- 3. Official English proficiency test scores (see below)
- 4. Official bank statement indicating at least \$10,913 US Dollars for one semester or \$21.935 US Dollars for two semesters
- 5. Copy of passport and any visa you hold for the United States
- 6. Proof of Meningitis Vaccine (to be submitted after UIW student ID is issued)

An admissions decision cannot be determined until all official documentation has been received. Only applicants nominated by the home institution will be processed.

IMPORTANT: A copy of the student's meningitis vaccine (MCV4/MenACWY) can be submitted through email to admissiondocs@uiwtx.edu. Include **first and last name** and **UIW student ID number**.

COURSE REGISTRATION

Upon admission to UIW, exchange students must complete and submit the Exchange Student Course Request form to studyabroad@uiwtx.edu.

Students are required to enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours and no more than 18 credit hours. Courses will be submitted to the Academic Advising Center for processing. Class enrollment operates on a first come-first-serve basis.

TRANSCRIPTS

Students must <u>submit a request</u> through Credentials Solutions, Inc. for an official UIW Transcript. Transcripts are not automatically sent to you or your home institution. Upon request, the Office of the Registrar will process and send your official transcript to your home country via United States Postal Service (USPS). Transcripts can only be released directly to the student or to a person or entity designated by the student.

Transcript fees are \$5.40 for a printed, mailed transcript and \$2.90 for an electronic copy. Additional fees apply for special services, such as express delivery.

Important: Transcripts will not be released until all holds (e.g., administrative, financial) are removed from the student's account. The University reserves the right to withhold transcripts for those students who have not met all conditions for admission or who have outstanding financial obligations.

J-1 VISA

Students who are accepted into UIW's exchange program will receive a Certificate of Eligibility (DS-2019) and information packet with next steps from International Student & Scholar Services. For more information, please contact us at intl@uiwtx.edu.



HEALTH INSURANCE

Exchange students are required to purchase international health insurance from UIW *only*. Other insurance will not be accepted.

PROOF OF MENINGITIS VACCINE

Texas State law (SB 62) mandates that all entering students under the age of 22 provide a certificate signed by a health care provider or an official immunization record verifying that the student has been vaccinated against bacterial meningitis or has received a booster during the five years preceding admission to the University.

A copy of the student's meningitis vaccine (MCV4/MenACWY) can be submitted through email to admissiondocs@uiwtx.edu. Include **first and last name** and UIW student ID number.

BUDDY PROGRAM

Upon arrival, students will be paired with a globally minded International Ambassador who will help with adjustment to life at UIW as well as provide peer support, guidance, and resources.

HOUSING AND MEALS

A representative from International Affairs will contact exchange students with information about on-campus accommodation after the student has been admitted.

Exchange students are required to live on campus and purchase a meal plan. No exceptions.

Students must submit a \$225 housing deposit to complete the housing application.
