SEMESTER PLACES & DURATION OF EXCHANGE

In most Memorandums of Understanding and/or Agreements, a specific number of student semester places are agreed upon. We honor the amount set in these agreements, but are willing to consider offering more student semester places if needed. Students may apply for one semester or one academic year.



APPLICATION PROCESS

- The home university will nominates students through our nomination portal
- Students will receive an email with the link to the application portal
- Application is submitted by the deadline
- Our staff will review applications
- Student admittance email through the portal with link to Exchange Confirmation Form
- Student submits Exchange Confirmation Form
- Acceptance Letter is sent and visa document review begins
- Students complete Class Preferences Form with prerequisite information if needed.
- Visa documents are issued
- Students complete checklist items through the Application Portal which include: Photo for ID, Health Requirements, Housing Contract, etc.



APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must complete an online application. Documents needed to complete the application process:

- English Ability Form - If submitting
- Certification of Finances Form
- Proof of Finances - Supporting documents: bank statement/letter, loans, scholarships.
- Copy of the information page of your Passport
- Copy of your Academic Transcript



ACADEMICS & MAJORS

Exchange students are eligible to take most classes in our four schools: **David D. Reh School of Business, Wallace H. Coulter School of Engineering, School of Arts & Sciences and Institute for Sustainable Environment.** In order to take a class that has prerequisites, you will need to provide proof that you have taken similar classes to meet those requirements. CREDITS & TRANSCRIPTS

International Students must meet the minimum credit requirement to maintain status.

Undergraduate students must enroll in:

- Minimum of 12 US credits
- Maximum of 18 US credits

Graduate students must enroll in:

- minimum of 9 US credits
- maximum of 15 US credits

Official Academic Transcripts will be **shipped** to the student's home university's international office within two weeks of the end of the semester.

Please note: If there is an outstanding balance on the student's account, the transcript will be held until the account clears.



LIVING EXPENSES

The estimated cost for attending one semester at Clarkson is approximately \$11,000 USD (exact total is located on the COF form). This estimate includes housing, food, books, personal expenses, and travel. We are unable to offer scholarships. Students must be able to prove they have the funding to attend Clarkson before visa documents will be issued.



ACCOMMODATION & ACTIVITIES

All exchange students are required to live on campus. Students do not need to apply for housing, it is guaranteed. Students will be housed in apartment style housing with other international and US students. Students are required to depart campus within 24 hours after their last final exam. HEALTH FORMS & INSURANCE

Students must complete health forms before coming to campus and absolutely before attending classes. Students may need to see a doctor prior to being able to complete these forms. These forms are accessible to the student after they receive their acceptance letter and must be completed in English.

Health insurance is mandatory and proof of health insurance will be required upon arrival. Students holding a J-1 visa status must meet required standards as outlined in their documents.



ARRIVAL TRANSPORTATION

Recommended airports of arrival are:

- Hancock International Airport (SYR) in Syracuse, NY
- Ogdensburg International (OGS) in Ogdensburg, NY

From SYR students catch the [Trailways bus](#) which makes two trips per day north to Potsdam arrives directly at Clarkson's campus! Transportation from OGS is provided with [advance notice](#) of travel plans. Canadian arrivals are **highly discouraged**.

Once students arrive on campus, they will be greeted by our Global Ambassadors and escorted to their accommodations/housing.
