- Communication skills – oral and written

- Self-discipline, self-direction, independence of mind and initiative alongside an ability to work with others
- Organisation and time management skills
- Goal achievement and an ability to meet deadlines

Some graduates choose to work in writing-related fields including journalism, technical writing, publishing, public relations, and advertising as well as other careers which could include banking, civil service, tourism, retail, education, libraries, social services among others.

All these careers require the skills of research, analysis, and writing, for which a degree in English is excellent preparation.

Work experience is also a key issue and any experience you have to add to your CV will be a bonus. Volunteering is also an excellent way of adding experience to your CV.
