Geography graduates and the employment market

Geography students acquire a wide range of skills and qualities that are valuable in many professions. The combination of numerical and analytical skills are highly sought after by many sectors of employment. Some of the specific skills gained while doing a degree in Geography include:

- Interpreting different types of geographical evidence such as texts, imagery and maps
- Scientific laboratory techniques
- Using social survey and interpretative methods; collecting and analysing information using different methods
- Field research
- Map and diagram production
- Recognising the moral and ethical issues involved in debates and enquiries
- Using social survey and interpretative methods
- Collecting and analysing information using different methods (e.g. GIS, remote sensing)
- Research, writing and presentation skills
- Numerical skills, including interpreting and presenting relevant numerical information
- Self-management, time management and planning skills
- Information, communications and technology skills (ICT)
- Analytical skills - being able to analyse, synthesise, evaluate and identify problems and solutions
- Working with others as a result of developing interpersonal skills, planning skills and teamwork

Geography students pursue a variety of careers and can work in advertising, marketing, banking, business management, media, tourism and as consultants (such as Environmental, GIS, and Planning) as well as development and aid agencies.

All these careers require the skills of research, analysis, numerical skills for which a Geography degree is an excellent preparation.

Work experience is also a key issue and any experience you have to add to your CV will be a bonus. Volunteering is also an excellent way of adding experience to your CV.
