STATUTE LVI

WE the Governing Body of University College, Galway, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred on us by the above Acts, DO by this present instrument under the seal of University College, Galway, make the Statute contained in the Schedule hereto for the general government of the said College.

SCHEDULE—STATUTE LVI

All previous Statutes of University College, Galway shall be read and construed with the alterations, additions and modifications hereinafter set forth.

CHAPTER I.

PROFESSORSHIP OF INORGANIC CHEMISTRY AND  
PROFESSORSHIP OF ELECTRON PHYSICS.

1. There shall be established in the College in the event of their institution by the Senate of the National University of Ireland, a full-time Professorship of Inorganic Chemistry (within the Department of Chemistry) and a full-time Professorship of Electron Physics (within the Department of Experimental Physics).

2. The annual stipend of the holder of each of the foregoing two Professorships shall be £2,600 on appointment increasing to a maximum of £3,200 by annual increments of £60 for each completed year of service since appointment. The Governing Body may in its discretion in accordance with Statute LIV of University College, Galway, and if the President (having regard to the qualifications and College service if any of the person appointed) so recommends fix the commencing stipend of the Professorship at any point in the incremental salary scale applicable thereto.

3. (a) The foregoing two Professorships shall be pensionable offices within the meaning of Chapter XXV of Statute XVII of University College, Galway, and the amendments thereto and shall be annexed to the appropriate Table of the Pension Scheme. The holder of each Professorship shall be entitled to payment of both Pension and Gratuity in accordance with the provisions of Chapter II and Chapter III of Statute XXXVI of University College, Galway and the Statutes of the College.

(b) The annual stipend for the purpose of calculating Pension and Gratuity in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Statutes of the College shall be deemed to be that payable at date of retirement or death of the holder pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of this Chapter.

(c) There shall be paid into the Pension Fund such additional sum as an actuary shall certify to be necessary for providing such Pension and Gratuity as aforesaid.

4. The holder of each of the foregoing two Professorships shall be entitled to the annual allowances in respect of a wife and children payable pursuant to Statute XXXVII and Statute LV of University College, Galway.

## CHAPTER II

### NEW FULL-TIME LECTURESHIPS

1. There shall be established in the College in the event of their institution by the Senate of the National University of Ireland nine full-time Lectureships as follows :—

- (i) A Lectureship in Modern Irish. The Holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Modern Irish.
- (ii) A Lectureship (No. 2) in Ancient Classics. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Ancient Classics.
- (iii) A Lectureship in French. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Romance Languages.
- (iv) A Lectureship in Zoology. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Zoology.
- (v) A Lectureship in Biochemistry. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Biochemistry.
- (vi) A Lectureship in Applied Economics. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Economics, Commerce and Accountancy.
- (vii) A Lectureship (No. 3) in Civil Engineering. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Civil Engineering.

(viii) A Lectureship (No. 2) in Physiology. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Physiology.

(ix) A Lectureship in Microbiology. The holder shall carry out the duties of the Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Bacteriology.

2. The annual stipend of the holder of each of the foregoing full-time Lectureships shall be £1,700 on appointment increasing to a maximum of £2,400 by annual increments of £70 for each completed year of service since appointment. The Governing Body may in its discretion in accordance with Chapter II of Statute LIV of University College, Galway if the President (having regard to the qualifications and College service if any of the person appointed) so recommends fix the commencing stipend of the Lectureship at any point in the incremental salary scale applicable thereto.

3. The holder of each of the foregoing nine Lectureships shall subject to good conduct and to the due fulfilment of his duties hold office for seven years after which he shall be eligible for re-appointment. If reappointed he shall subject to good conduct and the due fulfilment of his duties hold office until he shall have attained the age of sixty-five years and may thereafter be continued in office for five further years: *Provided* that such further continuance in office is recommended to the Senate of the National University of Ireland by the Governing Body with the approval of the President and is sanctioned annually by the said Senate.

4. (a) The foregoing nine Lectureships shall be pensionable offices within the meaning of Chapter XXV of Statute XVII of University College, Galway and the amendments thereto and shall be annexed to the appropriate Table of the Pension Scheme. The holder of each Lectureship shall be entitled to payment of both Pension and Gratuity under and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter II and Chapter III of Statute XXXVI of University College, Galway and the Statutes of the College.

(b) The annual stipend for the purpose of calculating Pension and Gratuity in accordance with the relevant provisions of existing Statutes of the College shall be that payable at date of retirement or death of the holder pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of this chapter.

(c) There shall be paid into the Pension Fund such additional sum as an actuary shall certify to be necessary for providing such Pension and Gratuity as aforesaid.

5. The holder of each of the foregoing nine Lectureships shall be entitled to the annual allowances in respect of a wife and children payable pursuant to Statute XXXVII and Statute LV of University College, Galway.

CHAPTER III

1. Nothing herein contained shall affect any appointment made right acquired or act done under any previous Statute of the College.

2. This Statute shall come into operation on the Eleventh day of June, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-four and may be cited as Statute LVI, University College, Galway or Stat. LVI, Univ. Coll., Galway.
