

IRISH UNIVERSITIES ACT, 1908.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE, GALWAY.

STATUTE XXIV.

WE, the Governing Body of University College, Galway, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred on us by the said Act, do by this present instrument under the seal of University College, Galway, make the Statute contained in the Schedule hereof for the general government of the said College.

Given under the Common Seal of University College, Galway, this Fifteenth day of October, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-six.

SCHEDULE.—STATUTE XXIV.

1. All previous Statutes of University College, Galway, shall be read and construed with the alterations, additions and modifications hereinafter set forth.

2. Section 11, Chapter XXV of said Statute XVII, and section 6 of Statute XX of University College, Galway, are hereby revoked and the following is substituted in lieu thereof.

The pensions in all cases shall be annual allowances computed as follows:—

(1) In the case of the President, £17 10s. 0d. for each year of service as President, together with the annual amount computed for years of service in any of the offices hereafter specified, during the period for which such office may have been held, previous to an appointment as President. If the President is also a Professor or Lecturer, he shall receive no pension

computed upon any years of service as Professor or Lecturer during the period in which he may be President.

(2) In the case of the person who held the Deanship of Residence to the 25th day of October, 1934, £11 for each year of service from the 1st day of October, 1911, to the said 25th day of October, 1934.

(3) In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Pathology, £11 for each year of service from the 1st day of October, 1909.

(4) In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Geology, including Physical Geography, and Mineralogy, £10 15s. 0d. for each year of service as such Professor.

(5) In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Philosophy, £10 for each year of service as such Professor.

(6) In the case of any subsequent holder of (a) the Professorship of Pathology, £10 for each year of service as such Professor; (b) the Professorship of Geology and Mineralogy and the Professorship of Philosophy, £9 for each year of service as such Professors.

(7) The annual pension shall be computed upon the basis of £10 for each year of service in the offices following, namely:—

The Professorships of (a) Irish Language, Philology and Literature; (b) Ancient Classics; (c) Mathematics; (d) Experimental Physics; (e) English Language and English Literature; (f) Chemistry; (g) Natural History; (h) Civil Engineering; (i) Anatomy; (j) Physiology.

In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Irish Language, Philology and Literature, his years of service shall be counted from the 1st day of October, 1909.

(8) The annual pension shall be computed upon the basis of £9 for each year of service in the offices following, namely:—

The Professorship of (a) Mathematical Physics;

(b) Romance Languages; (c) German; (d) History; (e) Economics, Commerce and Accountancy; (f) Education; (g) Celtic Archaeology; the Lectureship in Modern Irish.

(9) In the case of the office of Lady Superintendent, £3 10s. 0d. for each year of service as Lady Superintendent.

(10) In addition to pensions there shall be paid to the holder of each of the offices mentioned in this subsection, on retirement, or to his or her personal representative in case of death, the gratuity hereafter set forth for each year of actual service in the College, provided, however, that (a) a gratuity shall not be payable in respect of any one of said offices unless the holder thereof has had five actual years of service in the College in a pensionable office; (b) the maximum number of years to be taken into account when calculating the amount of the gratuity shall be ten:—

I. One-tenth of the combined salaries attached to the Presidency, and to such other pensionable office (if any) that he may hold during his tenure of the Presidency, to the President.

II. £80 to the Professors of (a) Irish Language, Philology and Literature; (b) Ancient Classics; (c) Mathematics; (d) Experimental Physics; (e) English Language and English Literature; (f) Chemistry; (g) Natural History; (h) Civil Engineering; (i) Anatomy; (j) Physiology, and (k) Pathology.

III. £70 to the Professors of (a) Mathematical Physics; (b) Geology, including Physical Geography and Mineralogy; (c) Romance Languages; (d) German; (e) History; (f) Philosophy; (g) Economics, Commerce and Accountancy; (h) Education.

IV. £70 to the future holder of the Professorship of Celtic Archaeology.

V. £70 to the Lecturer in Modern Irish.

VI. £20 to the Lady Superintendent.

3. Section 6 of the Pension Scheme in Chapter XXV of said Statute XVII, and Section 7 of said Statute XX, are hereby revoked and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:—

The pensions in all cases shall be annual allowances computed as follows:—

(1) In the case of the President, £17 10s. 0d. for each year of service as President, together with the annual amount computed for years of service in any of the offices hereinafter specified, during the period for which such office may have been held, previous to an appointment as President. If the President is also a Professor or Lecturer, he shall receive no pension computed upon any years of service as Professor or Lecturer during the period in which he may be President.

(2) In the case of the person who held the Deanship of Residence to the 25th day of October, 1934, £11 for each year of service from the 1st day of October, 1911, to the said 25th day of October, 1934.

(3) In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Pathology, £11 for each year of service from the 1st day of October, 1909.

(4) In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Geology, including Physical Geography, and Mineralogy, £10 15s. 0d. for each year of service as such Professor.

(5) In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Philosophy, £10 for each year of service as such Professor.

(6) In the case of any subsequent holder of (a) the Professorship of Pathology, £10 for each year of service as such Professor; (b) the Professorship of Geology and Mineralogy and the Professorship of Philosophy, £9 for each year of service as such Professors.

(7) The annual pension shall be computed upon the basis of £10 for each year of service in the offices following namely:—

The Professorships of (a) Irish Language, Philology

and Literature; (b) Ancient Classics; (c) Mathematics; (d) Experimental Physics; (e) English Language and English Literature; (f) Chemistry; (g) Natural History; (h) Civil Engineering; (i) Anatomy; (j) Physiology.

In the case of the present holder of the Professorship of Irish Language, Philology and Literature, his years of service shall be counted from the 1st day of October, 1909.

(8) The annual pension shall be computed upon the basis of £9 for each year of service in the offices following, namely:—

The Professorships of (a) Mathematical Physics; (b) Romance Languages; (c) German; (d) History; (e) Economics, Commerce and Accounting; (f) Education; (g) Celtic Archaeology; the Lectureship in Modern Irish Language.

(9) In the case of the office of Lady Superintendent, £8 10s. for each year of service as Lady Superintendent

(10) In addition to pensions there shall be paid to the holder of each of the offices mentioned in this sub-section on retirement or to his or her personal representative in the case of death, the gratuity hereafter set forth for each year of actual service in the College, provided, however, that (a) a gratuity shall not be payable in respect of any one of said offices unless the holder thereof has had five actual years of service in the College in a pensionable office, (b) the maximum number of years to be taken into account when calculating the amount of the gratuity shall be ten:—

I. One-tenth of the combined salaries attached to the Presidency and to such other pensionable office (if any) that he may hold during his tenure of the Presidency, to the President.

II. £80 to the Professors of (a) Irish Language, Philology and Literature; (b) Ancient Classics; (c) Mathematics; (d) Experimental Physics; (e) English Language and English Literature; (f) Chemistry; (g)

Natural History; (h) Civil Engineering; (i) Anatomy; (j) Physiology, and (k) Pathology.

III. £70 to the Professors of (a) Mathematical Physics; (b) Geology, including Physical Geography and Mineralogy; (c) Romance Languages; (d) German; (e) History; (f) Philosophy; (g) Economics, Commerce and Accountancy; (h) Education.

IV. £70 to the future holder of the Professorship of Celtic Archaeology.

V. £70 to the Lecturer in Modern Irish Language.

VI. £20 to the Lady Superintendent.

4. In compliance with section 1 of said Pension Scheme in Chapter XXV of Statute XVII, Table B, which will be found at foot of this section, is hereby prepared and annexed to said Scheme.

TABLE B.

The Professorship of Celtic Archaeology.

5. (1) This Statute shall be construed with and as part of said Statutes XVII and XX of University College, Galway, and it shall not affect any appointment made, right acquired, liability incurred, or act done under any previous Statute of the College.

(2) This Statute shall come into operation on the Fifteenth day of October, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-six.

(3) This Statute may be cited as Statute XXIV of University College, Galway, or Stat. XXIV of Univ. Coll. Galway.
