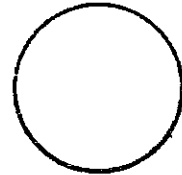
STATUTE XXXIII.

WE the Governing Body of University College Galway under and by virtue of the Powers in that behalf conferred on us by the above Acts DO by this present Instrument under the Seal of University College Galway make the Statute contained in the Schedule hereof for the general government of the said College.

SCHEDULE—STATUTE XXXIII.

All previous Statutes of University College Galway shall be read and construed with the additions modifications and amendments hereinafter set forth.

CHAPTER I. NEW LECTURESHIPS.

- x. There shall be established in the College in the event of their institution by the Senate of the National University of Ireland seven full-time Lectureships as follows :—
 - (i) A Lectureship in Botany. The holder shall carry out the duties of this Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Natural History.
 - (ii) A Lectureship in Experimental Physics. The holder shall carry out the duties of this Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Experimental Physics.

- (iii) A Lectureship in Mathematical Physics. The holder shall carry out the duties of this Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Mathematical Physics, the Professor of Mathematics, and the Professor of Experimental Physics in a manner to be prescribed.
 - (iv) A Lectureship in Chemistry. The holder shall carry out the duties of this Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Chemistry.
 - (v) A Lectureship in Romance Languages. The holder shall carry out the duties of this Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Romance Languages.
 - (vi) A Lectureship in Celtic Languages namely Irish, Scotch Gaelic, and Welsh. The holder shall carry out the duties of this Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Modern Irish and the Professor of Old and Middle Irish and Celtic Philology in a manner to be prescribed.
 - (vii) A Lectureship in Philosophy. The holder shall carry out the duties of this Lectureship under the direction of the Professor of Philosophy.
2. (a) A Candidate shall not be appointed to any of the foregoing Lectureships unless he or she is found competent (in the manner provided by Statutes XXIII and XXXII of University College Galway) to discharge the duties thereof through the medium of the Irish Language.
- (b) The holders of the foregoing Lectureships shall deliver lectures and instruction through Irish and through English in such manner that the Professors of the Subjects concerned with the Lecturers and Assistants (if any) assigned to them may in co-operation between them provide a complete course through the medium of Irish and a complete course through the medium of English.
- (c) Where the holder of any of the Professorships set forth in the Tables to Sections 2 and 3 of Chapter II of this Statute was deemed on appointment to possess the language qualification as defined in Statute XXIII of University College Galway and has assigned to him one of the seven Lecturers to be appointed in pursuance of this Statute, such Professor shall give lectures and instruction through Irish and through English in such manner that the Professor Lecturer and Assistant or Assistants (if any) may in co-operation between them provide a complete course in the Subject through the medium of Irish and a complete course through the medium of English.

- (d) Paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section in so far as they provide for Courses through the medium of English shall apply only where the Subject of instruction is one in which a full course through the medium of English is already in existence in the College.
3. The stipend of each of the foregoing seven Lectureships shall be £650 per annum increasing by £40 per annum until a maximum stipend of £850 per annum shall be reached. The first increment of £40 shall accrue on the first day of October next following the date of first appointment to a Lectureship. In the case of any particular Lectureship aforementioned the Governing Body may before proceeding to make an appointment thereto prescribe a higher commencing stipend than the minimum stipend of £650 per annum so as such commencing stipend shall not exceed £850 per annum.
 4. All the foregoing Lectureships shall be pensionable offices within the meaning of Chapter 25 of Statute XVII and the amendments thereto and shall be annexed to Table B of the Pension Scheme. There shall be paid into the Pension Fund such additional sum as an Actuary shall certify to be necessary for the purpose of providing Pensions for the said offices. The stipend of each of the said Lectureships for pension purposes within the meaning of Statute XXVIII of University College Galway shall be £850 per annum.
 5. In addition to pension there shall be paid to the holder of each of the foregoing Lectureships on retirement or to his or her personal representative in case of death a gratuity of £85 per annum for each year of actual service in the College provided :—
 - (a) Gratuity shall not be payable in respect of any of the said Lectureships unless the holder thereof has had five years of service in the College in a pensionable office ;
 - (b) The maximum number of years to be taken into account when calculating the amount of the gratuity shall be ten.

CHAPTER II. INCREASED STIPENDS.

- i. The office of President shall henceforth be a full-time office the holder of which shall not be at the same time a Professor Lecturer or Assistant in the College. The President may however with the permission of the Governing Body but without remuneration deliver lectures or a course of lectures in such subject or subjects as he may select. The stipend of the President shall be £1600 per annum. He shall in addition be entitled

- to residence fuel and light as heretofore and shall be further entitled to an allowance of £200 per annum to cover the expenses incidental to his position. The stipend and allowance aforesaid shall be payable by the College as from 1st November, 1946
2. The stipend of each of the Professorships set out in the Table to this Section shall be £900 per annum for the first year of service increasing by £60 per annum until a maximum stipend of £1200 per annum shall be reached. The stipends of present holders with increment additions shall be calculated accordingly and the increased stipends so calculated shall be payable by the College as from the 1st November, 1946 but without any other arrears of any kind. The first increment of £60 shall accrue and in the case of present holders shall be deemed to have accrued on the first day of October next following the date of first appointment to the Professorship. In the event of a vacancy in any particular Professorship set forth in the Table the Governing Body may before proceeding to make an appointment thereto prescribe a higher commencing stipend than the minimum stipend of £900 per annum so as such commencing stipend shall not exceed £1200 per annum.

3. The stipend of each of the Professorships set out in the Table to this Section shall be £850 per annum for the first year of service increasing by £50 per annum until a maximum stipend of £1100 per annum shall be reached. The stipends of present holders with increment additions shall be calculated accordingly and the increased stipends so calculated shall be payable by the College as from the 1st November 1946 but without any other arrears of any kind. The first increment of £50 shall accrue and in the case of present holders shall be deemed to have accrued on the first day of October next following the date of first appoint-

ment to the Professorship. In the event of a vacancy in any particular Professorship set forth in the Table the Governing Body may before proceeding to make an appointment thereto prescribe a higher commencing stipend than the minimum stipend of £850 per annum so as such commencing stipend shall not exceed £1100 per annum.

- The stipend of the present holder of the Professorship of Celtic Archaeology payable by the College as from the 1st November 1946 shall be £1,100 per annum. The stipend of any future holder shall be £850 per annum for the first year of service increasing by £50 per annum until a maximum stipend of £1,100 per annum shall be reached. The first increment of £50 shall in the case of a future holder accrue on the first day of October next following the date of first appointment to the Professorship. In the event of a vacancy in the Professorship the Governing Body may before proceeding to make an appointment thereto prescribe a higher commencing stipend than the minimum stipend of £850 per annum so as such commencing stipend shall not exceed the maximum stipend of £1,100 per annum.
- The stipend of each of the Lectureships set out in the Table to this Section shall be £650 per annum for the first year of service increasing by £40 per annum until a maximum stipend of £850 per annum shall be reached. The stipends of present holders with increment additions shall be calculated accordingly and the increased stipends so calculated shall be payable by the College as from the 1st November 1946 but without any other arrears of any kind. The first increment of £40 shall accrue and in the case of present holders shall be deemed to have accrued on the first day of October next following the date of first appointment to the Lectureship. In the event of a vacancy in any particular Lectureship set forth in the Table the Governing

Body may before proceeding to make an appointment thereto prescribe a higher commencing stipend than the minimum stipend of £650 per annum so as such commencing stipend shall not exceed the maximum stipend of £850 per annum.

6. The stipend of the present holder of the Lectureship in Civil Engineering payable by the College from the 1st November 1946 shall be £850 per annum. The stipend of any future holder shall be £650 per annum increasing by £40 per annum until a maximum stipend of £850 per annum shall be reached. The first increment of £40 shall in the case of a future holder accrue on the first day of October next following the date of first appointment to the Lectureship. In the event of a vacancy in the Lectureship the Governing Body may before proceeding to make an appointment thereto prescribe a higher commencing stipend than the minimum stipend of £650 per annum so as such commencing stipend shall not exceed the maximum stipend of £850 per annum.
7. The stipend of the Lectureship in Electrical Technology Applied Heat and Mathematics shall be £850 per annum in the event of the appointment to the said Lectureship of the present holder of the Assistantship in Electrical Engineering and Mathematics. The stipend of any other future holder shall be £650 per annum increasing by £40 per annum until a maximum stipend of £850 per annum shall be reached. The first increment of £40 shall in the case of any other future holder accrue on the first day of October next following the date of first appointment to the Lectureship. The Governing Body may prescribe a higher commencing stipend than the minimum stipend of £650 for any other future holder so as such commencing stipend shall not exceed the maximum stipend of £850 per annum.
8. The annual stipends of the Professorships Lectureships and Offices set out in the Table to this Section shall henceforth be the respective sums set opposite the title of such Professorship Lectureship or Office in the said Table. The said stipends

shall be payable by the College as from the 1st of November, 1946.

9. Statute XXIX of University College Galway shall continue to apply but shall be read with the following variations:—

- (a) As if the Stipends therein set forth of the Professorship of Therapeutics Pharmacology and Materia Medica, the Professorship of Medicine, the Professorship of Surgery, and the Professorship of Midwifery and Gynaecology, were in each case £450 per annum.
- (b) As if the figures and words "£300 per annum" were substituted for the figures and words "£188 per annum with £12 additional per annum so long as the additional income of the College shall continue" wherever these latter words and figures appear in the said Statute.

CHAPTER III.

- Nothing hereinbefore contained shall affect any appointment made right acquired liability incurred or act done under any previous Statute of the College.
- This Statute shall come into operation on the Tenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven and may be cited as Statute XXXIII of University College Galway or Stat. XXXIII Univ. Coll. Galway.
