Tá OÉ Gaillimh (Ollscoil na hÉireann, Gaillimh) ag spreagadh na heagna ó 1845 mar ollscoil atá á treorú ag an taighde agus tá sí ar cheann de na hollscoileanna is sine agus is mó in Éirinn. Suite i gCathair na Gaillimhe in Iarthar na hÉireann, áit ar a bhfuil cáil mar gheall ar a cultúr uathúil, tionscail chruthaitheacha, teicneolaíochtaí leighis, éiceolaíocht agus geilleagar muirí, agus nuálaíocht, cuireann OÉ Gaillimh roimhe an t-aistriú chuig todhchaí níos inbhuanaithe a threorú agus táimid tiomanta ár mbuanna agus ár scileanna a úsáid chun aghaidh a thabhairt ar Spriocanna Forbartha Inbhuanaithe na Náisiún Aontaithe ar bhealaí go leor.

Chomh maith leis sin, tá breis is 19,000 mac léinn againn, 18% díobh ina mic léinn idirnáisiúnta ó 122 tír, agus cuirimid le héagsúlacht agus le spleodar ár réigiúin agus níos faide i gcéin. Tá pobal acadúil de thaighdeoirí den scoth againn agus iad ar thús cadhnaíochta ina réimsí féin agus cuirimid deiseanna ar fáil dár gcuid mac léinn comhoibriú ar bhonn idirnáisiúnta. Tá clú agus cáil sheanbhunaithe ar an Ollscoil as feabhas teagaisc agus taighde agus breis is 2,770 comhalta foirne, agus 110,000 líonra alumní aici ar fud an domhain. Tá OÉ Gaillimh ar cheann de na fostóirí is mó i nGaillimh agus cuireann sé go mór le creatlach eacnamaíoch, shóisialta agus chultúrtha na cathrach.

Áirítear OÉ Gaillimh ar an 1% is fearr d'Ollscoileanna de réir Ranguithe Ollscoile Domhanda QS 2021. Léiríonn sin go bhfuil an Ollscoil ar cheann de scoth-institiúidí oideachais an domhain i gcónaí.
