- In 1908, it was changed to University College Galway, or UCG for short
- In 1997, it was changed again to National University of Ireland Galway, or NUI Galway for short
- In 2022, it was renamed to University of Galway

MEMORIAL LECTURES

MONSIGNOR P. DE BRÚN

- The Monsignor de Brún Memorial Fund is derived from a Testimonial to Right Reverend Monsignor Pádraig de Brún, M.A., D.Sc., subscribed by his many friends to mark the occasion of his retirement from the Presidency of University of Galway. An eminent and remarkably versatile Scholar, especially gifted in the study of Languages and of Mathematical Science, Monsignor de Brún was President of the University from 1945 to 1959. The Memorial Fund, which amounted to €508 on 15th December 1960, comprised the balance of the Testimonial Fund left after defraying the costs of a bronze portrait bust (which was presented to Monsignor de Brún, in Galway, in May, 1960).
- The income from the Fund shall be used to endow a public lecture in the University, to be known as Léacht Chuimhneacháin an Mhonsignor P. de Brún.
- The Lectures shall be given on subjects in the Sciences and in the Humanities (in cluding Fine Arts), alternately, every two or three years.
- The Lecturers shall be Visiting Lecturers selected by the President.
- Proposals for the Lecture may be submitted to the President at his request.
