Táimid anseo inniu chun ceiliúradh poiblí a dhéanamh ar an ghaisce acadúil atá déanta agaibh i gceann bhur gcuid cúrsaí léinn le cúpla bliain anuas. Lá mór i bhféilire na hOllscoile atá ann agus ócáid níos mó agus níos tábhachtaí arís in bhur saol féin. Go maire sibh bhur gcéimíocht úr agus guím gach rath oraibh sa tsaol atá romhaibh amach mar chéimithe de chuid Ollscoil na hÉireann, Gaillimh.

The formal ceremony today, which involves a procession led by a mace bearer, musical accompaniment, the special robes, and the use of Latin, English and Irish, has a long tradition spanning many centuries. In Ireland it goes all the way back to the first university, established in Dublin in 1320, though it no longer exists, and has continued through the establishment and continuation of ten further universities. This University was originally one of three Queen's Colleges established in 1845 in Belfast, Cork and Galway.

Then as now this University and its staff have been about ensuring that those who pass through here as students go out into the wide world equipped with the best education that they can get and that we can give them. The word 'university' comes from the Latin

Bob Quinn

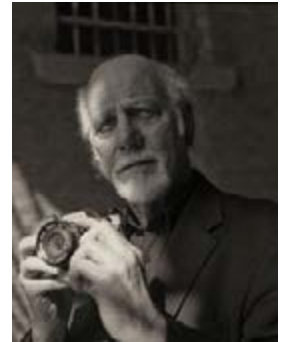

His 70-odd drama and documentary films include 'The Atlantean Quartet'; 'Poitin'; 'Budawanny', 'Cloch'; 'Graceville', etc. His work has largely featured the Gaelic-speaking community in which he lives.

His books include 'Smokey Hollow', 'An Tír Aneol – the unknown country' (photography); 'Maverick - a dissident view of broadcasting'; 'The Atlantean Irish'; 'The Accompanist' (novel).

His recent film, 'Bog Graffiti' is a short meditation on climate change, and was shown at the Irish Film Festa, Rome and the Galway Film Fleadh.

Latest novel is 'Darwin on the Shannon' and his latest venture in visual art is wood carving.



Tá OÉ Gaillimh (Ollscoil na hÉireann, Gaillimh) ag spreagadh na heagna ó 1845 mar ollscoil atá á treorú ag an taighde agus tá sí ar cheann de na hollscoileanna is sine agus is mó in Éirinn. Suite i gCathair na Gaillimhe in Iarthar na hÉireann, áit ar a bhfuil cáil mar gheall ar a chultúr uathúil, tionscail chruthaitheacha, teicneolaíochtaí leighis, éiceolaíocht agus geilleagar muirí, agus nuálaíocht, cuireann OÉ Gaillimh roimhe an t-aistriú chuig todhchaí níos inbhuanaithe a threorú agus táimid tiomanta ár mbuanna agus ár scileanna a úsáid chun aghaidh a thabhairt ar Spriocanna Forbartha Inbhuanaithe na Náisiún Aontaithe ar bhealaí go leor.

Chomh maith leis sin, tá breis is 19,000 mac léinn againn, 18% díobh ina mic léinn idirnáisiúnta ó 122 tír, agus cuirimid le héagsúlacht agus le spleodar ár réigiúin agus níos faide i gcéin. Tá pobal acadúil de thaighdeoirí den scoth againn agus iad ar thús cadhnaíochta ina réimsí féin agus cuirimid deiseanna ar fáil dár gcuid mac léinn comhoibrú ar bhonn idirnáisiúnta. Tá clú agus cáil sheanbhunaithe ar an Ollscoil as feabhas teagaisc agus taighde agus breis is 2,770 comhalta foirne, agus 118,000 alumni aici ar fud an domhain. Tá OÉ Gaillimh ar cheann de na fostóirí is mó i nGaillimh agus cuireann sé go mór le creatlach eacnamaíoch, shóisialta agus chultúrtha na cathrach.

Ainmníodh muid mar Ollscoil na Bliana 2022 sa Sunday Times, rangaitear ár dtionchar agus ár n-éachtaí i measc an 2% is fearr d'institiúidí ardoideachais ar fud an domhain, de réir Ranguithe Ollscoile QS an Domhain 2021, agus rangaíodh muid i measc na n-ollscoileanna is fearr ar domhan maidir le staidéar ar 19 n-ábhar. Rangaithe sa 82ú háit i Ranguithe Domhanda 2021 maidir le Spriocanna Forbartha Inbhuanaithe, tá OÉ Gaillimh ag déanamh obair éachtach maidir le SDG 7: Fuinneamh Inacmhainne & Glan agus muid sa 14ú háit, táimid sa 44ú háit maidir le SDG 3: Dea-Shláinte & Folláine, sa 71ú háit maidir le SDG 5: Comhionannas Inscne agus sa 62ú háit maidir le SDG 10: Éagothroime Laghdaithe.
