


Figure 1. Word count of some of the most frequent action / prompt words used by citizens from a random sample of 700 responses (50 from each country*) to the Q. "What, in your opinion, are the top priorities for protecting public health and the health of the marine environment for a sustainable future?"





Fig 2. Word count by country of key words, 'pollution', 'plastic' and 'sewage' in citizen priorities for OHH from a random sample of 700 responses (50 from each country*)











Fig 3. Word count by country of the key words '**climate**', '**energy**' and '**oil**' in citizen priorities for OHH from a random sample of 700 responses (50 from each country*)



OHH Priority Categorisation













Fig 4. Citizen's structural map of priority pathways for OHH in Europe, emphasising the complexities of OHH, interrelationships between priority areas and forces at play within a dynamic OHH system (read left to right).


