Masks

Visitors are welcome to wear masks at open day but it is not a requirement.



Don't Attend If...

You have symptoms, you have tested positive, if you have been advised to self-isolate or restrict your movements.



Hygiene

Practise good hand, respiratory & general hygiene throughout your visit.

You develop symptoms while attending the event.

Open Days

University of Galway looks forward to welcoming prospective students and visitors onto campus for our open days. The COVID-19 measures below are in line with the recent easing of Government COVID-19 restrictions and in line with university health and safety guidelines.

We expect it will be a busy event and talk venues will be open at full capacity. At peak times, the exhibition spaces are likely to be crowded. Therefore you can expect to be in close proximity to other visitors at certain stages of the event.

What to Expect on Campus

- For big events, registration will take place outdoors (with tents) and will be spread across two locations.
- There will be no physical distancing measures in place.
- Visitors will be provided with wipes upon entrance to each talk venue to wipe down their seat. The wipe can be disposed of by the visitor at the end of the talk.
- Hand sanitiser will be available across open day venues.
- A gap between talks has been built into the schedule to allow for ventilation breaks.
- In an effort to spread footfall and avoid busy crowds, for bigger events, the exhibitions will be spread across campus in different 'zones'.
