
## Is child poverty a 'messy' problem?




A situation is complex or messy when there is a multitude of interrelated variables (stuff!) AND there is a range of perspectives.






- ✓ Children are more likely to be in poverty than adults.
- ✓ Child poverty is about more than money.
- ✓ Child poverty travels across generations.
- ✓ Certain groups of children are at much greater risk.
- ✓ Child poverty is situated in families and communities.
- ✓ Not all poor children live in income poor households.
- √ There is an established and ambitious policy agenda.

# Child poverty rates have gradually declined over the last 20 years, but deprivation is volatile

"... exposure to EV [Economic Vulnerability] during childhood is associated with poorer outcomes ... These outcomes cover a range of key dimensions, including cognitive and educational attainment, school engagement, socio-emotional development, life satisfaction, self-concept, chronic illness/disability, obesity, health behaviours (for example, smoking, drinking for the '98 cohort) and quality of relationships... In the majority of cases, there appears to be a cumulative effect of exposure ... That said, even transitory spells of EV are associated with worse outcomes compared to never experiencing EV" (ESRI, 2021).





Those who experience poverty in childhood face an increased risk of experiencing it as adults

Most of the relationship between poverty in childhood and in adulthood is explained by educational attainment and current employment situation

This suggests the need for social policy aimed at breaking the cycle of poverty... policies that seek to reduce persistent inequalities in educational outcomes, from early childhood throu education, are crucial.


#### "We want all children to be happy and well cared for"

# Role of the Programme Office




The Child Poverty and Well-being Programme Office was established in the Department of the Taoiseach in Spring 2023 to coordinate and focus Government action on child poverty and well-being.

#### Its role is to:

- 1. Monitor the delivery of policy commitments by Departments and their Agencies.
- 2. Undertake a small number of **strategic initiatives** which have the potential to increase the impact of current and emerging measures.

In August 2023, the Office published its initial work programme for the next two and a half years, *From Poverty to Potential: A Programme Plan for Child Poverty and Wellbeing 2023-2025*


